# UK hosts talks with 35 nations on Strait of Hormuz transits — with one notable absentee

US not part of discussions after Donald Trump warned of two to three weeks of continued bombing

The UK hosted an online meeting of 35 countries on Thursday to discuss how to reopen the Strait of Hormuz after Donald Trump said it was the job of other

countries to get oil moving again.

The meeting — which did not include the US — was to assess all viable “diplomatic and political measures” to restore freedom of navigation after fighting has stopped, said British Prime Minister Keir Starmer.
