US and Iran reported to have agreed tentative ceasefire extension — with no Hormuz tolls

Memorandum of understanding requires approval of Trump and Iranian officials

The US and Iran have reportedly reached a tentative agreement that would extend a fragile ceasefire between the two countries by 60 days.

US officials familiar with the matter told the Associated Press and CNN that the memorandum of understanding also calls for talks on Iran's nuclear programme and rules out tolls on the Strait of Hormuz.



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But the agreement is not final, requiring approval by US President Donald Trump and officials in Tehran.

An official told the AP that the tentative deal also requires Iran to remove mines from the strait within 30 days.

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It is not clear whether Trump or Iranian Supreme Leader Mojtaba Khamenei will sign off on the agreement.
